Message on 2011 Tohoku-Kanto Earthquake

On behalf of the Japan Chemical Industry Association, I would like to express heartfelt sympathy to all persons and families who suffered loss in the devastating Tohoku-Kanto Earthquake and Tsunami of March 11, 2011. It is a very sorrowful time for all of us and I can think of no words to comfort those affected by this unprecedented disaster. We are grateful for the outstanding efforts of the rescue workers and response teams from Japan and from around the world that are providing support and assistance during this most difficult time.

The earthquake has caused serious damage to the power supply infrastructures of the Tokyo Electric Power Company and Tohoku Electric Power Company, and as a result there is an electricity shortage in not only the disaster-affected areas but throughout Kanto as well. Voluntary power-saving efforts and scheduled blackouts have severely affected industrial activity and everyday life.
